Becky's advice to anyone who wants to work in the community, or isn't sure if they are ready to was,

"Do it. Sometimes it is scary, but you have to try. You will get to be more independent. You have to be to work on time and you can't call in sick a lot. You will learn how to do things on your own. You will make a lot of friends at work too. That's my favorite part. Just try it because I am so glad I did."

She is a motivator to her friends here. They see her success and are able to see themselves being successful working in the community.

One of the interesting aspects of the application is that it can be individualized to specific needs of the person. You can set timers, give verbal and visual prompts, add rewards and praise to tasks and so much more. It is also HIPAA compliant, all information is secure. We look forward to initializing this application and expand its use to enhance the services we provide to all.

We are fortunate enough at CE to team up with Michigan State University to review and develop this application for use in the state of Michigan. Together, with our input, MSU will be evaluating the application and its uses. The staff of CE and the individuals using the application will be asked to report on various aspects of the application. Dr. Hung Jen Kuo, Assistant Professor of the Office of Rehabilitation and Disability Studies of MSU will analyze the information gathered from us and the other 3 organization in the trial over the course of 6 months. MSU research team will report their findings. All information gathered is secure and only viewed by those on the research team. The possibilities are enormous!
